

Refusal of Consent for Vaccinations

Under the International Declaration of Human Rights, no medical treatment can be given without the free, informed consent given by the intended recipient of such treatment – or, in the case of a minor, his/her legal guardian.

This letter is to formally inform you that I, the Parent/Legal Guardian, named hereunder, DO NOT consent to any of the following medical treatments for my/our son/daughter:

1. Any COVID-19 'vaccine' or any mRNA gene therapy or any attenuated virus vaccine or any viral vector vaccine or any other vaccine or therapeutic for the purposes of treating COVID-19.
2. Any other vaccine (attenuated virus or viral vector vaccine or any other vaccine) for any childhood disease, including vaccines for measles, smallpox, RSV, HPV, etc.
3. Any vaccine booster.
4. Any PCR test (can damage nasal passage).

I/We DO NOT consent to vaccines for my/our child, and they DO NOT consent to them either. This applies to any vaccines given in any formula, whether via injection, orally, or by any other means.

Criminal-coercion may not be used to persuade my/our son/daughter to accept a vaccine under any circumstances. He/she understands the risks of vaccinations, and chooses to not receive them.

Failure to abide by this will be considered as criminal assault, and you will be held liable in your private capacity. My/our son/daughter will carry a copy of this letter at all times on his/her person.
